Introduction

The year 2019-20 was a witness to many events and success stories of the college. All the success can be attributed to the dedication and team spirit of the staff (teaching as well as non-teaching) and students of this prestigious institution.

Situated at the foothills of the majestic Dhauladhars, Govt. College of Teacher Education, Dharamshala is the oldest training institution of the state and enjoys a magnificent history of achievements. It was established in September 1956, by the Government to meet the ever-increasing demand of trained teachers. It remained the only college of education in the state till 2002, when private entrepreneurs were allowed to open education colleges in the state. To explore the maximum potential in the field of education, it was upgraded from Govt. College of Education to Govt. College of Teacher Education on 24thFeb. 1993, by the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Govt. of India. Since then the college has been catering to the demands and needs of in-service teachers.

The college is not only the first choice for new entrants to the pre-service Bachelor of Education course in the State but is also progressing as a centre of excellence for the In-service Teachers Training Programmes which came into existence in 2012, after the new Training Policy was announced by the State Government. The college organizes Induction Training for new entrants and Capacity Building Training for In-service teachers, Heads of schools, Ministerial staff, Librarians, Assistant Librarians and Laboratory staff of six districts of Himachal Pradesh, namely Chamba, Hamirpur, Kangra, Kullu, Lahaul Spiti and Mandi.

Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC)

As per the requirement of NAAC, the college has a functional IQAC (Internal Quality assurance Cell). Under the aegis of the cell, all the developmental activities of the college with respect to teaching-learning, research, inter-institutional collaboration, infrastructure etc. are planned and implemented. IQAC prepares the Annual Work Plan and the Annual Quality Assurance Reports (AQARs) which are regularly sent to NAAC, Bengaluru.

Equal Opportunity Cell

The grants coming under Equity Initiative Plan from RUSA are being spent on girls and weaker sections of the college by organising various activities, workshops and purchasing of books for the Book Bank. Financial aid is also provided to the needy and weaker sections of the college.

Library

Library is the life-line and integral part of any institution. The college has a library which is being computerized and has a total member of 8337 books, on various subjects. 492 books are available in the Book Bank. The students make the maximum use of the library. The library has subscription to 8 magazines (4 English and 4 Hindi) and 9 newspapers.

Teacher Trainings

The Department of Higher Education, Government of Himachal Pradesh formulated its Training policy in 2012 and GCTE was mandated to provide training to schools and colleges of six districts of Himachal Pradesh. This year 10 training programmes were organised for Headmasters / Principals / Ministerial Staff / Librarians / PGTs (Schools) and 278 participants were trained in these trainings. 04 Trainings were organised for Assistant/Associate Professors/ Librarians/ SLA/JLA (College) and 94 participants were trained in these trainings.

Training School Safety Project 2020

07 Training programmes were organised under the School Safety Project sponsored by Revenue Department (Disaster Management Cell), Govt. of Himachal Pradesh for Headmasters / Principals / Administrators / PGTs (Govt / Private Schools) and 113 participants were trained under these trainings.

Houses

There are four Houses in the college viz. Swami Vivekananda House, Swami Rabindranath Tagore House, Dr. Abdul Kalam House and Mahatma Gandhi House. Various Inter-House Competitions (academic, cultural, co-curricular and sports) are held throughout the year.

Sports

Our college fully realizes the significance of sports activities and ensures that our trainees remain engaged in various co-curricular activities throughout the year. The scheduled sports activities for the session 2019-20 could not be completed due to lockdown.

Co-Curricular and Extracurricular activities

- An Open Debate Competition was organised by "Amar Ujala" on the topic "One Nation, One Election" on 3rd August, 2019. Two students from our college took part, and Mr. Raman Sharma won the second prize.
- Rakhi Making Competition was organised on 10th August, 2019 in the college. Ms. Shilpa won the first prize and Ms. Priyanka Negi won the second prize.
- Declamation and Poetry recitation competitions were organised on Drug Addiction on 15th Nov, 2019. Ms. Richa was declared first in declamation and Ms. Anjali Pathak won the first position in poetry recitation.
- With the aim of eradicating drug addiction, Poster making and Slogan writing competition was organised in the college on 21st Nov, 2019. Neha was judged first in Slogan writing and Sanjeevani Kashyap won the first prize in Poster making.

Girls Hostel

The college has a Girls Hostel, which has the capacity to accommodate 68 girls. Smt. Babita Chambial is the Hostel Warden. Ms. Aditi Thakur (Semester-IV) is the Hostel Prefect and Ms. Shilpa is the Mess In-charge. The students of the hostel are excelling in all fields and the results of the hostel girls in the House Examinations was commendable.

The Unit consists of 24 rovers (boys) and 24 rangers (girls). The unit took oath to obey the rules and regulations of scouting. After the oath ceremony, all rovers and rangers took part in a cleanliness campaign at War memorial, Dharamshala. Mr. Heera Singh and Ms. Kalpana were elected as rover leader and ranger leader respectively. The unit made and distributed the face masks during Covid-19 lockdown. The unit prepared posters for awareness against Covid-19 in the month of April, 2020.

Red-Ribbon Club

Acting upon the directions of H.P. AIDS Control society, Red Ribbon Club was established in the college in 2006 which became instrumental in spreading awareness about this disease in the college and in the adjoining areas. In this session, club observed World AIDS Day by organising a series of events. On 19th Nov, 2019 Speech competition and Poetry recitation competition were organised by the Red Ribbon Club. On 30th Nov, 2019 Poster making competition on "AIDS Awareness" was organised in which Ms. Kanchan won the first prize while Ms. Sanjeevani Kashyap stood second.

Hindi Diwas was celebrated on 14th Sept, 2019 Prof. Anjali Sharma enlightened the students on the importance of Hindi language, students presented solo songs, poems and their thoughts on the topic.

Career Guidance & Counseling Cell

During the session 2019-20, a number of activities were organised by the Cell on educational, vocational and personal-emotional issues. An awareness session was organised on disability on "International Day for Persons with Disability" on 3rd Dec, 2019. A series of preparation sessions for UGC NET, HPTET, CTET were conducted.
