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PREFACE

District Kangra is prone to various hazards both natural and manmade. Main hazards consist of earthquakes, landslides, floods, Heavy rains, flash floods, fires domestic and wild, accidents road, rail and air, stampedes, Industrial hazards etc. However, the hazard which poses the biggest threat to the district is that of earthquakes. District Kangra is one of the highly seismically active regions in the world and falls in earthquake zone-V. Many disaster incidents have also been reported from various Educational Institutions of H.P. as these are using inflammable material such as LPG cylinders, oil and plastic made utensils for mid-day meal in kitchens. Hence lack of knowledge and skill in using fire safety equipments raises serious question about safety of the Colleges.

The information provided endorses the fact that the safety of all stakeholders of the institution, to both education and safety, must be safeguarded simultaneously. Disaster-resilient education and safe Colleges are within reach. It requires sincere efforts to assess local risks and institutional capacities and to develop a well-planned and self-sufficient mechanism of preparedness.

Educational Intuitions are one of the most important resources of communities and need to be protected. When an educational intuitional is vulnerable to any hazard, the welfare of the entire community is at risk. Every educational intuition needs to be prepared as no location, district or state is immune to disaster. Considering the fact that external help may reach to the educational intuition very late, it is important that College teachers, staff and students learn about the key aspects of educational intuitional safety and preparedness. It is critically required that the educational intuitional administration take proactive measures to increase awareness about disaster preparedness and also test their disaster preparedness plans through conducting mock drills at regular intervals.


For making the College a safer place; for all stakeholders should have clarity and better understanding of the roles and responsibilities.




2.1 Hazard Profile of Himachal Pradesh

The entire state of Himachal Pradesh is prone to various hazards both natural and manmade. In the District the geological hazard, mainly earthquakes, landslides and soil erosion are most critical, the flash flood, cloud burst, drought and forest fire are also hydro metrological hazard

2.2 Earthquake Vulnerability in Kangra (Himachal Pradesh)

Thestate of Himachal Pradesh lies almost entirely in the Himalayan mountains on or near to the Fault Line (Eurasian and Indo-Australian plate boundaries). Due to its location it weathers dozens of mild earthquakes every year. Chamba, Kullu, Mandi, and Bilaspur Districts lie in Zone V. The remaining districts of Lahaul-Spiti, Kinnaur, Shimla, Solan and Sirmour lie in Zone IV.

The whole district is prone to severe earthquake hazard. It has been subjected in 1905 to one of the giant earthquakes recorded in seismic history of India having a Magnitude of 8.0 on the open-ended Richter Scale in which 20000 persons had lost their lives, the town of Kangra and Dharamshala were razed to the ground and no-government functionary there was left alive even to report the happenings to higher authorities.

- Any significant disaster) to ensure that the plan is workable.
- Look into the structural safety requirements of the College for various Hazards (earthquake, fire, floods, cyclone, etc.). Get the College building assessed for the hazards identified and prompt remedial measures taken, as required.
- Earmark fund arrangements for carrying out preparedness and Mitigation measures in the College through College funds, corporate Sectors, civil societies and establishing linkages with various Departments and organization working in the field of disaster management.
- During a disaster the CDMC shall coordinate the groups and teams.
- Media Management to be carried out by the CDMC.

Roles and Responsibilities Awareness Campaign Team Before Disaster

- Collect, collate and develop IEC materials like Posters, Painting, Pamphlets, Simple Tips on Do's and Don'ts, Street Plays/ Nukkad Naataks, Poems, Songs, etc.
- Organize and conduct awareness programmes regularly in the College, targeting all staff/ teachers and student-teachers.
- Organize and conduct awareness programmes in the neighbouring areas in co-ordination with the local political representatives (Panchayat Member, Councillor, MLA, MP etc.), local Fire Station, and local NGOs, etc.
- Organize College health camps to orient the members on first-aid and search and rescue methodologies through linkages with the appropriate agencies.
- Assist in organizing regular fire and evacuation drills.
- Organize innovative activities and exercises for student and teachers on Disaster Management and preparedness to ensure continuing interest on the issue during normal time. The College can organize: -
- Art work: Posters, Bulletin Boards, Exhibitions, Wallpaper, Cards, Bookmarks etc.
- Creative Writing competitions Essays, Poetry, Slogans
- Drama Street Plays, "Nukkad Nataks', Role Playing.
- Songs Writing, Thematic Debates

During Disaster

- In case of emergency, advice students to take appropriate action
- Assist the fire Alarm Team in sending warning signals and helps the members to evacuate without panic.
- Assist the Evacuation Team in orderly evacuation of the College building.
- After Fire or Any Other Disaster
- Disseminate information on do's and don'ts so that the situation doesn't worsen, in coordination with the Fire Alarm Team.

Role and Responsibilities of Warning and Information Dissemination

1. Materials Require

• Contact details of the various local authorities, including the local Fire Station, District Administration, Police Station, Hearth Department, NGOs, Volunteer Organization, etc.

• Siren/ Alarm/ Bell, Flags of different colours to depict different level of signals (e.g. Red for Danger/ Existing Warning, Yellow for Wait or Stay Calm, Green for Exit Orderly or Go, Brown for Assembling Point, etc.)

Roles and Responsibilities

Before Disaster

- Take regular update from the Media (TV/Radio/Internet) on probable risks that the area can face and update the CDMC for appropriate action.
- Warn the College of any imminent hazardous situation.
- Post warning signs/flags of appropriate colour for different warning level placed/ positioned at designed places and inform all the staffs/teachers and students on the matter.
- Practice ringing special turned alarm to signal danger warning.
- Keep the other Team Members updated on any warning situations

During Disaster

- In case of emergency, advice students to take appropriate action.
- Check the warning received from various sources.
- Warn the whole College in case of any emergency by either ringing a bell/siren/ alarm or through public address system (P.A. system) or through a messenger, whatever is available and feasible.
- 4. The incident must be reported to the CDMC.

After Disaster

- Information sources must be monitored regularly.
- All the concerned Teams should be updated on the recent developments for better coordination.
- Prepare updates and disseminated necessary information to other emergency support functionaries in co-ordination with the CDMC

Role and Responsibilities of Evacuation Team

Before Disaster

- Ensure that all the exits are kept for ready opening, accessible and cleared of all blockades.
- Earmark the open spaces/areas within the College premises or outside for assembling after evacuation.

- Ensure that there the en-route to the designed assembly places are hazard free.
- Inform and assist the CDMC in conceptualizing alternate options in case evacuation is necessitated during blustery weather.
- During fire and evacuation drill, the response procedures for differently-abled students must be categorically developed and positioned.
- Evacuation procedures to be followed during drills must be disseminated to the entire College members, by carrying out innovative activities by Awareness Campaign Team.

During Disaster

- Evacuate in an orderly fashion as practiced in the drills.
- Guide the members to the designed places.

After Disaster

- The team should make sure that the designated safe places are easily accessible.
- Monitor a verify whether additional assistance is required for evacuation and report to CDMC.
- Head count and take Roll Call and report to CDMC. In case, the number doesn't match as per the attendance of the day report immediately to the Search and Rescue Team.

Roles and Responsibilities of Search and Rescue Team

Material Required

- The pictorial map of the entire College premises with clear indication of all entries, exits, staircases, corridors, gates, doors, windows etc.
- The evacuation Plan Document.
- Detailed information of the number of students in each class rooms/section and the number of employees /staffs/teachers.
- All the master keys of the College gates to be kept in an accessible place.
- Whistle to inform the trapped victims of their nearness and help.
- Rescue helmets, search lights, torches, lanterns, along with spare batteries and required fuel etc.
- Stretchers, ropes and ladders and another search and rescue equipments. Training required
- Training in all the basic aspects of search and rescue methodology/ and techniques through local Fire service.

Roles and Responsibilities

Before Disaster

- Ensure that all the necessitated equipment and supplies are readily available and accessible.
- Ensure that all the team members are well trained and are active performers.
- Ensure that the entire evacuation route is clear of any blockades.

During Disasters

- Activate search and rescue operation as per the plan and procedures.
- Rescue and carry the victims to the designated places (e.g. carrying to the first-aid point or placing the victims into the ambulance, etc.)
- Report ad updates rescue procedure to CDMC and also ensure all members are out of the building.

After Disaster

- Check one on one rooms in the College building thoroughly (visually, vocally, physically) to ensure that no one is left behind.
- The injured victims may be carried to and handed over to the first-aid team.
- Assess thoroughly and look out for any structural/non-structural problems/significant structural damages and report to the CDMC.

Role and Responsibilities of First-Aid Team

• This team may include the first-aid in-charge, 4 senior, teachers and 2 senior students from each section/class (Preferably from NCC/Bharat Scouts & Guide and students interested in health issue).

Materials required

- A basic medical supply kit to be readily available at all times to cater to the needs of maximum members of the College at one time.
- Place first-aid kits in each class room, as per the number of students.
- Duly filled in health cards containing information on special medicines being regularly taken by any students/staffs/employees.
- List of information on available medical resources/chemist/medical stores near the College area.
- List and detailed information of all the important medical centre/facilities/hospitals/clinics available near the College.

Training required

- Training in basic first-aid techniques and cardio-pulmonary resuscitation by local health department.
- Thorough orientation on the lifesaving medicines that may be used or applied during an incident of fire or other emergencies.

Role and Responsibilities

Before Disaster

- Ensure that all the First Aid kit kept in the College's store is up-to-date.
- Ensure that the emergency cards and health details of each individual are up-to –date.
- Ensure refreshers training is given regularly for the existing members.
- Actively participate in regular fire and evacuation drills to ensure further improvements and competencies.

During Disaster

- During any Disaster Activate that First –Aid- Post.
- Provide basic first –Aid facilities/help to the needy.
- If reported of serious injuries assist the Search & Rescue Team.
- Take immediate position of the spot designated for catering first-aid.
- Provide basic first –aid to the injured.
- Record all cases and the treatment provided.

After Disaster

- Examine carefully and if further medical assistance is required, refer cases to the appropriate medical centres in co-ordination with the Transport Management Team.
- Send members along with the victims to further assist them for better health services.

Role and Responsibilities of Fire Fighting Team

• This team may include all teacher of the College and 2 senior student-teachers from each section (Preferably from NCC\Bharat Scouts & Guides opted in Under Graduate Programme).

Materials required

- Fire fighting equipments, including Fire Extinguishers.
- Rescue helmets and gloves.
- Pictorial map of the College indicating all entries, exit gates \ doors\ corridors, class rooms, main electric switch boards, available fire and other safely equipments.

Training Required

• Thorough orientation and training on the use of different types of fire extinguishers Training in basic fire fighting and fire safety techniques through the local fire services

Role and Responsibilities

Before Disaster

- Ensure that all fire fighting equipments including fire extinguishers, hose pipes sprinklers, smoke detectors are in working conditions
- Ensure that all team members are well acquainted and trained with the use to the existing fire equipments.
- Check and ensure that all non-structural risks are secured from causing fire including laboratories, cafeteria etc.
- Ensure that all aspects of recommendations from the fire services are positively and constructively implemented to ensure fire safety.

During Disaster

- If caught fire advice student on STOP, DROP, & ROLL methodology.
- Activate the fire fighting system to curtail the fire.
- Fight the fire safely until the local fire services reach and takeover.
- Once the fire service takes over the operation, assist them and also keep the SFMC regularly informed on the development.

After Fire or Any Other Disaster

- Keep regular check on the existence of fire and report to SFMC and site safety team.
- Curtail fire and ensure safety of persons at all means.
- Keep vigil over conditions that may further spread fire and seek support from maintenance staffs in removing any such items from the area.
- At all circumstances Switch off the main electric lines.

- Detailed information of the number of students in each class room/ sections and the number of employees/staffs/teachers.
- All the members' keys of the College gates to be kept in an accessible place.
- Pin boards and white boards to post signs and another warning sign materials.
- Identification badges, cards or armbands.

Role and Responsibilities

Before Disaster

- Co-ordinate with the CDMC, the transport management teams and the other emergency support functionaries to develop and establish a release policy and communicate the same to parents and staffs.
- Define clear procedure on how the pupils will be released in case of emergency.

During Disaster

- Activate the team to ensure that the whole College premises are cordoned off and the entry restricted only to emergency services.
- Assist the local police for crowd control and also in carrying out the rescue operations smoothly.

After Disaster

- Secure the building and ensure that all external gates and doors are locked well.
- Deploy one team at the main gate to deal with parents and other agencies.
- The same team may route and guide the emergency services team like fire, police, medical and other key volunteers to reach the incident site.
- Keep CDMC informed of the developments.
- 5. The students may be released as per the established release policy.

During /After Disaster

- Instruct and guide the vehicle personnel to carry out their given responsibility without panicking to ensure safety of all Members.
- Provide First-Aid to any injured in co-ordination with the First Aid team



4 MITIGATION MEASURES

The College Disaster Management Plan focuses on various mitigation measures to be undertaken by the College. Mitigation measure is a long-term exercise. It is necessary to prioritize the actions along with the nature of the threat and its potential to cause injuries and loss of life. Some of the non-structural measures like anchorage of almirahs, marking and clearance of exit routes, installation of warning alarms could be done immediately by incurring minimal cost, some other structural mitigation measures/repair works will require more time and funds.

As a part of mitigation action, College will also undertake periodic fire, electricity and building safety checks by involving officials from concerned departments. Other measures like testing of purity of drinking water and hygienic conditions in the College.

- 4.1. Listing of various non-structural measures to be undertaken in the GCTE, Dharamshala
 - Ensuring clear passages which are marked or to be used for evacuation routes.
 - Fixing of steel almirahs to the walls of staff room.
 - Securing fans and light from ceiling
 - Keeping fire extinguishers at marked places.
